<b>Abstract</b>	<p>Is 20th Century (medical/ bio-)ethics still fit for purpose given the manifold technological and scientific developments and social changes? This paper tries to develop an argument to the affirmative. Central to the paper is the idea that what is needed is perhaps not so much (or: not quite yet) a rethinking of bioethics, or of ethics more generally, but a) widespread integration of ethical reflection early on in curricula for future (medical) professionals, that focuses on b) promoting capacities for responsible conduct of research (RCR) in the face of fundamental change.</p> <p>Surely, employing these capacities may involve revisiting values, norms and principles. At the same time, bioethics being a normative discipline seems to suggest at least some limits concerning what we</p>





take to be the proper direction of fit. For instance, should we revisit norms and principles in research following the (potential) blurring of boundaries between clinical interventions and research resulting from developments in personalized medicine and big data approaches? Should we use considered values and principles to reflect on the desirability of blurring boundaries? From this perspective, reflection on whether or not to redefine bioethics is also a question about how to maintain its normative function in the face of technological, scientific and societal change.

This paper will make the case for a capacity-based approach in research ethics as a way of creating resilience in bioethics. It will do so by drawing on examples and first results from the H2020 project Integrity, focusing on responsible conduct of research.

## 2. Project events

On 19<sup>th</sup> June the H2020 INTEGRITY consortium held an General Assembly meeting via Skype to discuss the ongoing tasks in each of the work packages. Specific topics that were discussed were the following: Data Management Plan, Dissemination and Communication Plan, Development and Exploitation Plan, Development of the Survey Tool, Mapping & evidence-based assessment of educational methods and tools, Development and design novel RCR-teaching, the engagement with the European Student Convention, The Acceptation of the Innovation Officer, External Expert Advisory Board, Update information about previous meetings and the Vilnius Meeting.

For work package 3 a single-day meeting in Zurich was organised together with the Utrecht University partner early July (15-16), to be updated on the progress and discuss how both partners in the work package could spread the workload and continue the work collectively in the most successful manner.
